### FILM SCREENING AND DISCUSSION: "82 NAMES"

Wednesday, November 6, at 7:00 p.m., in Shreve Auditorium (GISB 0001)

Join the Hamilton Lugar School, in collaboration with the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum, for a screening of "82 Names", a documentary film that traces the journey of Mansour Omari, a survivor of torture and imprisonment in Syria. When Mansour was released from prison, he smuggled out scraps of cloth sewn within the shirt he was wearing, with the names of his cellmates written on them with ink made from blood and rust. Following the film there will be a discussion moderated by the director of the USHMM Simon-Skjodt Center for the Prevention of Genocide.
